A tract of land located in the Southwest Quarter of the Southeast Quarter ($SW\frac{1}{4}SE\frac{1}{4}$) of Section Ten (10), Township One Hundred Forty-nine (149) North, Range Thirty-eight (38) West, of the Fifth Principal Meridian, described as follows, to-wit:

Commencing at a point on the West boundary line of the Southwest Quarter, of the Southeast Quarter ($SW\frac{1}{4}SE\frac{1}{4}$), Section Ten (10), Township One Hundred forty-nine (149) North, Range Thirty-eight (38) West, where said boundary line intersects the center line of the Sault Ste. Marie Railway (presently known as the Soo Line) right of way thence North Fifty (50) Feet to the North right of way line of said railway at the point of beginning; thence continuing North on said Quarter line of the Southeast Quarter a distance of Four Hundred (400) Feet, thence at right angles and East a distance of Four Hundred Twenty (420) Feet thence at right angles and South to the North right of way line of the Sault Ste. Marie Railway, thence Northwesterly along the railway right of way line to the point of beginning, and

Commencing at a point on the west boundary line of the Southwest quarter of the Southeast quarter (SW₁SE₄), Section Ten (10), Township One Hundred Forty-nine (149) North, Range Thirty-eight (38) West, where said boundary line intersects the center line of the Sault Ste. Marie Railway (presently known as the Soo Line) right of way, thence North Fifty (50) Feet to the North right of way line of said railway as the point of beginning; thence continuing North on said quarter line of the Southeast quarter a distance of Four Hundred (400) Feet, thence at right angles and East a distance of Four Hundred Twenty (420) Feet, thence at right angles and South to the North right of way line of the Sault Ste. Marie Railway, thence Northwesterly along the railway right of way line, to the point of beginning, and

A tract of land described as follows:

Commencing at a point on the West quarter line of the Southwest quarter of the Southeast quarter (SW₁SE₄), Section Ten (10), Township One Hundred Forty-nine (149) North, Range Thirty-eight (38) West, of the Fifth Principal Meridian, according to the government survey thereof, where said quarter line intersects the center line of the Sault Ste. Marie Railway (presently known as the Soo Line) right of way, thence North Fifty (50) Feet to the North right of way line of said railway as the point of beginning; thence continuing North on said quarter line a distance of Four Hundred (400) Feet; thence West at 90°, a distance of Ninety-eight and four tenths (98.4) Feet; thence South at 90°, to the North right of way line of the Sault Ste. Marie Railway; thence Northeast-
erly along the railway right of way line to the point of beginning, said tract being a tract of land 98.4 Feet wide and located in the Southeast quarter of the Southwest quarter (SE₁SW₄) of Section Ten (10), Township One Hundred Forty-nine (149) North, Range Thirty-eight (38) West, of the Fifth Principal Meridian, according to the government survey thereof.
