PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, Presidents' Day has been observed throughout the nation for the past fourteen years; and

WHEREAS, the office of the President of the United States of America is the highest and most important office that an American citizen may attain; and it is the living and working symbol of our American way of life, our Flag, and our Constitution; and

WHEREAS, the free people of our nation and the world today face their greatest trials for survival of this way of life; and

WHEREAS, a study of the lives of our presidents is a study of our American history and heritage,

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Karl F. Rolvaag, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim March 4, 1964, as

"PRESIDENTS' DAY"

In Minnesota and invite the citizens of our state, young and old, to observe the day in such a manner as they may desire in schools and other suitable places with ceremonies appropriate to the recognition of the office of the President of the United States of America; and that all our people, young and old be invited to write some letter or postcard to the President of the United States on this date.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this twenty-sixth day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and sixty-four and of the State the one hundred sixth.
