PROCLAMATION

- WHEREAS, the well-being of the State of Minnesota and of the Nation is dependent on the education and training being provided to our youth, and
- WHEREAS, a vital role is being played throughout the Nation by the more than two million teachers dedicated to providing the best possible education for all, and
- WHEREAS, Minnesota's future depends on - and our people are proud of - the more than 43,000 teachers in our state...including thirty-three thousand elementary and secondary public school teachers and four-thousand members on the faculties of the state's public, private and parochial colleges and universities...

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Karl F. Rolvaag, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do declare April of 1964 as

"TEACHING CAREER MONTH"

and urge all Minnesotans to pay tribute to one of our most valuable resources - the skill, devotion and dedication of our teachers - by working to provide opportunities that make teaching more effective, to encourage the best teachers to remain in the profession and to encourage teaching as a career for more of our young people.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this fifth day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and sixty-four, and of the State the one hundred sixth.
