- WHEREAS, One hundred years have passed since a small convention of educators met near Gettysburg, Pennsylvania, for the first annual assembly of the National Teachers' Association, and
- WHEREAS, The meeting was called a success and those present agreed to meet in Washington, D.C., the next year where the work of organizing the National Association of School Superintendents was completed, and
- WHEREAS, The centennial observance in Minnesota of the American Association of School Administrators is a celebration of service to America's future, and
- WHEREAS, The Association has reaffirmed its belief that a state-wide system of public education, universal, equal, and free to all children, youth and adults, is essential to Democracy, and
- WHEREAS, The Association has recognized that to ensure quality of educational opportunity, special provisions must be made for the slow, the average, the able, the disadvantaged and the handicapped, and
- WHEREAS, The American Association of School Administrators, has played and continues to play a vital role in the accomplishment of these objectives,

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Karl F. Rolvåg, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the year 1964 to 1965 as,

"100th ANNIVERSARY OF THE AMERICAN ASSOCIATION
OF SCHOOL ADMINISTRATORS"

In Minnesota, and want it to be known to all our citizens that for 100 years this organization has contributed extensively to the realization of the American ideal of free and universal education.
