WHEREAS, the contribution to the health and well-being of our citizens by nurses and nursing students far exceeds their service in our hospitals, and


WHEREAS, it is necessary that our citizens gain a better understanding and appreciation of the role played by the nursing profession in all phases of our community life,




"NURSES SUNDAY IN MINNESOTA"
