P R O C L A M A T I O N

WHEREAS, the maximum participation of our citizens in the elective process is a basic need for the development of our democracy, and

WHEREAS, the participation of American women in past elections has not been as great as that of men, and

WHEREAS, the League of Women Voters and other dedicated groups of our citizens have been undertaking special programs to ensure an increased participation of women in our elections, Lyndon B. Johnson, President of the United States of America, has designated the week beginning September 13, 1964, as Women Voters Week.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Karl F. Rolvung, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week September 13-19, 1964,

"WOMEN VOTERS WEEK"

In Minnesota, and with the President urge all local election officials throughout Minnesota to join with private citizens and citizens organizations to publicize registration arrangements during that week and during the whole of the pre-election registration period so as to bring the greatest possible number of our citizens to the polls on November 3.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this twenty-ninth day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred sixty-four and of the State, the one hundred seventh.
