WHEREAS, the conservation of human lives, our most precious asset, should be the near-highest preoccupation of all associations; and

WHEREAS, the mounting daily traffic death tolls are too often considered simply as statistics, devoid of the personal grief and hardship which each of the casualties represents, and

WHEREAS, we must remember that each accident deprives man's mate and our nation of the valuable and needless potential which each individual might possess, and

WHEREAS, labor has long recognized the necessity for reducing accidents, not only on the job but on the highways. It is fitting that, as the nation pays tribute to the working men and women, all citizens take the same caution to preserve every life which is part of the great and vital force that is labor.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Karl E. Solvaa, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of August 30 through September 7, 1964, as

"LABOR SAFETY WEEK"

in Minnesota, and urge all citizens to multiply their efforts to prevent accidents on the highway, in the home, on the job and in recreational areas.

In witness whereof, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this twentieth day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred sixty-four and of the State, the one hundred seventh.
