NOW, THEREFORE, I, KARL F. ROYLAND, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim September 5, 1964,

"HUBERT HUMPHREY DAY"

in Minnesota, and do urge all citizens to honor our senior United States Senator on this day for his many years of service to his fellow citizens here and throughout the nation.
