PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, qualities of temperance, respect for law, and a high sense of responsibility for the common welfare are essential qualities for the maintenance and development of healthy, happy and successful human lives and a high degree of social progress, and

WHEREAS, civic, educational, religious, social and other organizations can and do make a substantial contribution to the development of high moral, spiritual and social standards through temperance education for all, and especially for youth, and

WHEREAS, the future of our state and nation lies in the hands of the youth of today, and therefore, one of our greatest obligations is to develop in today's young people, by education and by example, the qualities that will enable them to make the most of that future,

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Karl F. Rolvaag, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Sunday, October 25, 1964,

"TEMPERANCE SUNDAY"

in Minnesota, and urge that citizens in churches, schools, clubs, and as individuals, join in the observance of the day, and further, make year-long efforts at public education and awareness of the wasted lives and desolate families caused by intemperance.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this twenty-second day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and sixty-four, and of the State the one hundred seventh.
