We, Joseph L. Donovan, Secretary of State; William P. Murphy, Associate Justice of the Supreme Court; James C. Otis, Associate Justice of the Supreme Court; William D. Gunn, Judge of the District Court, Fourth Judicial District; and Leonard J. 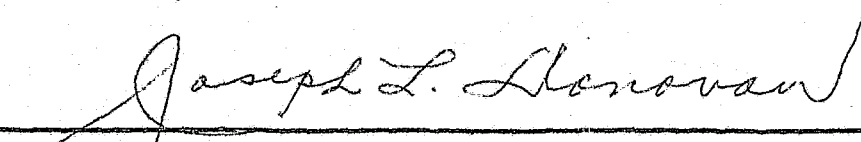

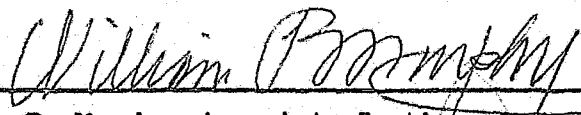

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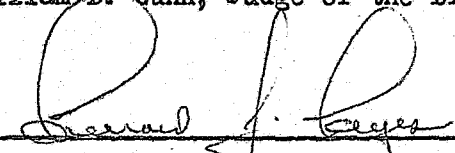
