AMENDMENTS TO THE CHARTER OF THE CITY OF WHITE BEAR LAKE, MINNESONA, ADOPTED AT SPECIAL CITY ELECTIONS HELD ON THE 3rd DAY OF NOVEMBER, 1964.

The Charter of the City of White Bear Lake, Minnesota is amended so as to abolish the offices of Justice of the Peace and Constable by striking and deleting in their entirety Sections 115, 116, 117, 118 and 119. By striking and deleting the words "Justice of the Peace" from Section 132;

Amendment No. 2

Section 50 of the Charter of the City of White Bear Lake, Minnesota is amended so as to increase the compensation paid to the Mayor and members of the City Council as follows:

Section 50. Compensation of Officers and Employees. The Mayor chall receive as compensation the sum of Seventy-Five Dollars (\$75.00) per month. Each member of the City Council shall receive as compensation the oum of Fifty Dollars (\$50.00)

The compensation of all other officials and employees shall be fixed by the City Council by Ordinance or Resolution duly enacted. This Amendment shall be effective February 1, 1965;

Amendment No. 3

The Charter of the City of White Bear Lake, Minnesote is amended so as to abolich the right of the Councilmen and City Manager to be "Fence Viewers" by deleting in its entirety Section 120;

Amendment No. 4

Paragraph 4 of Section 61 of the Charter of the City of White Bear Lake 1s amended so as to revise the amount that can be levied for the library fund by striking and deleting the words "three (3) mills on the dollar of all taxable property" and substituting in lieu thereof the words "the amount allowed by the Laws of the State of Minnesota;"

I, Milton L. Knoll, Jr., Mayor of the City of White Bear Lake, Ramsey County, Minnepota, hereby certify that the above amendments were drafted by a Board offreeholders appointed by the District Court of Ramsey County, Minnesota, Second Judicial District, and submitted to the Council and Mayor of the City of White Bear Lake, on the 25th day of September, 1964 and on the 13th day of October, 1964; that said amundments were duly voted on the 3rd day of November, 1964, that amendment proposals numbers 1, 2, 3 & 4 were passed by more than fifty five (55%) percent of the votes capt on the amondment; that the notice of such election, and the complete amendments as proposed were published once a week for two (2) successive weeks in the White Bear Press, a legal newspaper of general circulation in such City, prior to November 3,1964; that the amendments shall take effect thirty (30) days from the date of said election unless otherwise specified.
