WHEREAS, all of the land hereinafter described is completely surrounded by land within the Municipal limits of the City of White Bear Lake, Minnesota, and

WHEREAS, the City Council deems it advisable and in the public interest that said property be so annexed to the City of White Bear Lake in accordance with the Laws of the State of Minnesota.

NOW THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of White Bear Lake, Minnesota, does ordain as follows:

Section 1: That the following described real estate situated in Ramsey County, Minnesota:

All parcels of real estate that are not now a part of the City of White Bear Lake in Ramaley's Park, White Bear Lake, Minnesota, according to the plat thereof on file and of record in the office of the Register of Deeds in and for said County.

be and the same is hereby annexed to the City of White Bear Lake, Minnesota, and the said property is hereby declared to be an addition to said City.

Section 2: Upon the effective date of this Ordinance, such property shall become a part of said City as effectively and as if it has been originally a part thereof.

Section 3: This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication, and the City Manager of the City of White Bear Lake, Minnesota, is directed to cause a certified copy of this Ordinance to be recorded and filed in the office of the County Auditor, Ramsey County, Minnesota, the office of the Secretary of State for the State of Minnesota, and the Minnesota Municipal Commission.
