- WHEREAS, the purpose of Brotherhood Week is to symbolize renewed dedication to the ideals of greater tolerance, understanding, friendship, and cooperation among all our citizens, and greater respect for the differences and beliefs of our people, and
- WHEREAS, the people of Minnesota, though drawn from many varied backgrounds of race, religious faith and national origin, are unified in their devotion to their country and to the American way of life founded upon basic rights guaranteed by the Declaration of Independence and the Constitution, and
- WHEREAS, a Duluth citizens committee is coordinating a community-wide effort through the NAACP to collect food for families in Mississippi during Brotherhood Week to help make the American Ideal more personal and meaningful,

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Karl F. Rolvaag, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of February 22 - 28, 1965, as

"BROTHERHOOD WEEK"

In Minnesota, and do hereby urge our citizens in Duluth to heed the simple appeal: "During Brotherhood Week, add something to your shopping list for a family in Mississippi."

WHEREAS, the National Conference of Christians and Jews is diligently working to establish a social order in which the religious ideals of brotherhood and justice shall become the standards of human relationships and in furtherance of these goals undertake to sponsor Brotherhood Week for the education of our citizens to their individual responsibility in these efforts, and

WHEREAS, the people of Minnesota, though drawn from many varied backgrounds of race, religious faith and national origin, are unified in their devotion to their country and to the American way of life founded upon basic rights guaranteed by the Declaration of Independence and the Constitution,

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Karl F. Rolvaag, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of February 22 - 28, 1965, as

"BROTHERHOOD WEEK"

In Minnesota, and urge all our people to observe this week so that it will be a period in which we will rededicate ourselves to the American Ideal of equality of opportunity and to work toward enlarging it for all our citizens in a spirit of brotherhood and understanding.
