CHARTER AMENDMENTS - 1964

3. Chapter IV, Section 4.04. Candidates.

Subdivision 1. Not more than six (6), nor less than four (4) weeks before the municipal election, a candidate for a city office shall file an affidavit with the city manager, or an application on behalf of any qualified voter of the city whom they desire to be a candidate may be made and filed by not less than five voters thereof; provided that service of a copy of the application shall be made on such candidate and proof of service endorsed on the application before filing. In either case, the filing fee shall be \$5.00. Such affidavit or application shall state that the candidate is a qualified voter of the city of Coon Rapids, and name the office for which he is a candidate.

4. Chapter IV, Section 4.07 Primary Election. On the second Tuesday of each September there shall be a primary election for the selection of two (2) nominees for each elective office at the regular municipal election, unless only two (2) nominees file for each elective office.

5. Chapter VI, Section 6.06. Contracts: how let. In all cases of contracts for the purchase of merchandise, materials, or equipment or for any kind of construction work undertaken by the city, which require an expenditure of more than \$1,000.00, unless the council shall by an emergency ordinance otherwise provide, the city manager shall advertise for bids by at least 10 days published notice in the official newspaper, except that if the proposed contract will exceed \$100,000.00, then, the city manager shall advertise for bids by at least 21 days published notice in the official newspaper. Contracts of this magnitude shall be let only by the council upon recommendation of the city manager to the lowest bidder. The council may, however, reject any and all bids. Nothing contained in this section shall prevent the council from contracting by a four-fifths (4/5) vote for the doing of work with patented processes, or from the purchasing of patented appliances by the same majority. Nothing contained in this section shall prevent the purchasing of real or personal property on the installment payment plan.

Subject to the provisions of this charter, the council may by ordinance adopt further regulations for the making of bids, and the letting of contracts. The council may advertise in other papers, or trade journals in addition to the official newspaper.

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
