PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, for more than half a century Mother's Day has been observed by the American people on the second Sunday in May as the day when special tribute may be paid to the person to whom we are so much, and

WHEREAS, the setting aside of this date to honor American mothers has been established by action of the Congress of the United States by a resolution dated May 8, 1914, and

WHEREAS, it is fitting that in honoring motherhood, we highlight the career of ideal motherhood and the importance of the mother in the home, the community and the world,

WHEREAS, Mrs. Ida Eleanor Saenger has been selected as Minnesota Mother of the Year as exemplifying those qualities which we honor in Mothers.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Karl P. Polvay, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Sunday, May 9, 1965, as

"MOTHER'S DAY"

In Minnesota and urge that appropriate observances be held in honor of this day.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this thirteenth day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and sixty-five and of the State, the one hundred seventh.
