## PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, the year 1965 will mark the twentieth anniversary of the signing of the United Nations Charter in San Francisco, and

WHEREAS, the year 1965 has been designated by the United Nations General Assembly as International Cooperation Year and President Lyndon B. Johnson has so proclaimed it for the United States, and

WHEREAS, our future is made more secure when we can share with other members of the United Nations the responsibility for keeping the peace and building a better world, and

WHEREAS, it is essential in our democratic society to maintain informed public support for United States policies in the United Nations, and

WHEREAS, enlightened public opinion in this regard requires accurate and timely information about the United Nations and its large family of agencies whose activities serve the United States and all other members, and

WHEREAS, LYNDON B. JOHNSON, President of the United States of America, has proclaimed Sunday, October 24, 1965, as United Nations Day, and urged the citizens of this Nation to observe that day by means of community programs which will contribute to a realistic understanding of the aims, problems, and achievements of the United Nations and its associated organizations,

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Karl F. Rolvaag, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the day of October 24, 1965, as

### "UNITED NATIONS DAY"

In Minnesota and I urge the citizens of this state to participate in the programs in their communities which will demonstrate their faith in the United Nations and which will contribute to better understanding of its aims, problems, and accomplishments.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this twenty-sixth day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and sixty-five and of the State, the one hundred eighth.
