Emergency

PROCLAMATION

By the Governor

Executive Department
State of Minnesota

Excessive rains have caused catastrophic damage in the counties of Chicago, Dakota, Ramsey, and Washington, State of Minnesota. The excessive rains of May 31, 1965 have caused serious damage to both private and public property including state and county road systems. Extensive damage to drainage structures, roadbeds, and road surfaces has been sustained on the Federal Aid Primary and Federal Aid Secondary Systems.

Damage within the above mentioned counties has been disastrous to public highways, resulting in the necessity for immediate repair or reconstruction of highways and bridges on Federal Aid Primary and Federal Aid Secondary systems, and such conditions constitute an emergency as contemplated under Section 109 of Title 23 U.S. Code, of the Federal Highway Act of 1952.

I, **MINNERTON**, I, Earl P. Selnes, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim an emergency to exist within the Counties of Chicago, Dakota, Ramsey, and Washington, State of Minnesota, as a result of the excessive rains on May 31, 1965 and consequent damage to and loss of bridges and highways both on the Federal Aid Primary, and the Federal Aid Secondary systems; that the immediate repair and reconstruction of such damaged and destroyed highways and bridges is vital to the security, well-being, and health of the citizens of the State of Minnesota; and that the Federal Highway Administrator is hereby requested to concur in the declaration of this emergency.
