PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS, on April 24th, 1917, Officer George Connery of the Minneapolis Police Department disappeared while escorting to the police station a man he had arrested for violating the automobile laws, and

WHEREAS, there is reason to believe that the man placed under arrest and his companion have held captive or murdered the said Officer Connery and also that they had been guilty of prior crimes, and

WHEREAS, public welfare requires their capture, conviction and punishment for their offenses,

NOW THEREFORE, I, J.A.A. Burnquist, Governor of the State of Minnesota, will cause to be paid out of the Treasury of the State of Minnesota the sum of Two Hundred Dollars for the arrest and conviction of the said offenders, or for information leading to their arrest and conviction, and for information leading to the finding of the said Officer Connery or his body.
