RESOLVED:

By the National Progressive Party in National Convention assembled, that the membership in said Progressive National Committee of all the members elected by said National Progressive Convention of 1916, and otherwise, be and the same are now declared vacant for cause and that this Convention do now proceed by call of the States to elect a new Progressive National Committee to serve until their successors are elected by the Progressive National Convention called to nominate candidates for President and Vice-President of the United States in the year of 1920, and

RESOLVED, further-

That the Secretaries of State of the Several States of the Union be sent a copy of this Resolution and a roster of the new National Committee certified to by the Chairman and Secretary of this Convention.
