WHEREAS, the Federal, state and local governments are engaged in a cooperative program to construct highways that are safer, more efficient, more economical and more beautiful, and

WHEREAS, it is imperative that every Minnesotan recognize the importance of the state's road system and join in the effort to help promote safe and scenic roads in this state, and in recognition of the importance of highway transportation to the social and economic progress of our state, and

WHEREAS, the continued improvement of the state's highway system is vital to our safety and our social and economic welfare and plays an important role in the overall national defense for all Americans, and

WHEREAS, national priority has been given to improving safety at high-accident locations on our highways, and


WHEREAS, the President of the United States has called for a major effort to beautify our highways and roadsides, and to construct scenic and recreational roads,

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Karl F. Rolvaag, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim September 19, 1965 as

"STATE HIGHWAY WEEK"


in Minnesota, and I urge the mayors of all Minnesota cities to issue and observe similar proclamations.
