7 State, the result of the vote, of the electors of the Village of Wan-
8 amingo, cast upon the question, at a special election held May 28,
9 1917, whether said village should become and be a separate election
10 and assessment district, as appears by the certificate and return of
11 the judges of said election and the certificate and return of the
12 village council of said village, which has been duly certified to
13 me, as such Auditor, and filed in my office this 6th day of June,
14 1917, a true and correct duplicate original of which, and such fil-
15 ing thereof, is hereto attached and made a part of this certificate;
16 that from said certificate and return so filed in my office, it ap-
17 pears that there were cast at said election by the electors of said
18 village, casting their ballots upon said question, the total number
19 of fifty-two votes, forty-nine of said votes so cast by ballot being
20 in favor of such separation for election and assessment purposes and
21 three of such votes so cast being against such separation, and
22 *further certify* that said election was duly and regularly held
23 and that a majority of the electors of said village casting their
24 ballot on said question at said election, were in favor of such
25 change and separation from the townships of Minneola and Wanamingo,
26 in said county, as more fully appears by said return and certificate
27 of said village council and the judges of election.

To the County Auditor of said County:

We, the undersigned, the duly elected, qualified and acting village council of the village of Wanamingo, in said county, hereby certify and return that at the special election duly called and thereafter duly held on the 28 day of May, 1917, in said village, for the purpose of voting upon the question whether the said village should become and be separate from the townships of Wanamingo and Minneola in said county for election and assessment purposes and be a separate election and assessment district, there were cast at said election by the electors of said village casting their ballots upon said question the total number of 52 votes, 49 of said votes so cast by ballot being in favor of such separation for election and assessment purposes and 3 of such votes so cast at said election being against such separation, as more fully appears by the certificate of the judges of said election duly made to said village council by said judges of said election, a duplicate original of which certificate is hereto attached as part hereof.

We further certify and return that the votes cast at said election have been duly canvassed and the result thereof duly made and declared by us, and that a majority of such electors casting their ballots on said question at said election were in favor of such separation and change and that by such election and vote the said village, consisting of the west half of section 30 in township 110, north of range 16 west, and the east half of section 25 in township 110 north of range 17 west, in said county, was duly made a separate election and assessment district, as by law provided.

We, the undersigned, the duly appointed, qualified and acting judges of the special election of said village, duly called, and thereafter duly held, as herein stated, for the purpose of voting upon the question whether said village should become and be separated from the townships of Wanamingo and Minneola in said county for election and assessment purposes and be a separate election and assessment district, hereby certify and return that said election was held at the Wanamingo Village Hall on lot one of block nine in said village in said county, on the 28 day of May, 1917, the time and place specified in the election notice, a copy of which notice is hereto attached as part hereof, which notice was duly posted and published as by law required, to vote for or against the separation of said village from the townships of Wanamingo and Minneola in said county for election and assessment purposes and that at such election there were duly cast the total number of 52 votes by ballot for and against said proposition as canvassed by us, to-wit: There were cast for and in favor of such separation 49 votes. a separate election and assessment district?"
