WHEREAS, the memory of his deeds and heroism in a land far removed from his native Poland has served as a constant reminder and an inspiration to all Americans, but especially to those of Polish descent, and calls to mind the contributions that other distinguished citizens of Polish ancestry have made to this great nation, and

WHEREAS, General Pulaski's refentless yearning and striving for freedom for the appressed peoples of his native kand and all others throughout the world still serve as shining symbols to countless peoples who daily face adversity in the struggle for the liberation of all mankind.

NOW, THEREFORE, I. Karl F. Rolvaag, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby designate October 11, 1965, as

"GENERAL CASTAIR PULASKI DAY"

in Minnesota and I urge all citizens to pay tribute to the memory of this great leader in the Light for American Independence and freedom for all mankind.
