

PROCLAMATION

- Whereas, veterans, their family members and dependent survivors comprises nearly half of the Nation's population and
- Whereas, nearly 1,000,000 men and women have died in service so that we might enjoy the great heritage of freedom and liberty which is ours and
- Whereas, the people of this nation are grateful to the veterans of the Armed Forces who have performed their duties of citizenship and served successfully in times of peace and
- Whereas, the Congress of the United States, by Act approved June 1, 1954, Public Law 330, 83rd Congress, 68 Stat. 163, expanded the significance of November 11, previously declared a legal holiday and observed as Armistice Day, and designated it as Veterans Day in honor of veterans;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Karl F. Rolvåg, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim November 11, 1965, as

"VETERANS DAY"

in Minnesota, and urge all citizens to observe this day in appropriate ceremonies expressive of our people's desire for peace and their gratitude to our veterans who have served and sacrificed to attain it.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this nineteenth day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and sixty-five and of the State, the one hundred eighth.
