WHEREAS, the Minnesota swine industry leads in the development of high quality lean and tender pork cuts, and


WHEREAS, pork is offered to the consumer in more than eighty different products, which can be enjoyed at any meal during the day,


NOW, THEREFORE, I, Karl F. Rolvåg, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim January 11 - 18, 1966, as
