

PROCLAMATION


WHEREAS, The National Grange was organized in Washington, D. C. on December 4, 1867, and
WHEREAS, the first State Grange of the Nation was organized in Minnesota on October 23, 1869, and
WHEREAS, Oliver Hudson Kelley, the foremost of the Seven Founders of the Grange conceived this national farm fraternity while living on his farm near Elk River during the summer of 1866, which farm is now the property of the Minnesota Historical Society, and
WHEREAS, the spirit of the Grange movement for nearly a century has permeated every activity to bolster agriculture and to win greater recognition for the people who till the soil, and
WHEREAS, the National Grange will begin its Centennial year by holding its one hundredth annual session in Minnesota in 1966, for the first time since 1950 and for the second time in its 100 years,


NOW, THEREFORE, I, Karl F. Rolvaag, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of April 17 - 23, 1966, as


"GRANGE WEEK"
