WHEREAS, it is fitting that we gain a better understanding of the role played by our nursing students in all phases of community life, and

WHEREAS, the contribution to the health and well-being of our citizens made by the nursing student extends far above and beyond the purview of our hospitals, and

WHEREAS, nursing as a profession offers many avenues of service as well as useful lifetime preparation in whatever capacity the nurse may be called upon to serve, and


WHEREAS, there is a pressing need for greater numbers of qualified nursing personnel, a need which will continue to grow as medical services expand to meet the requirements of our increasing population and scientific and medical advances,

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Karl F. Rolveng, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of April 24 - 30, 1966, as


