PROCLAMATION

- WHEREAS, the purpose of Brotherhood Week is to symbolize renewed dedication to the ideals of greater tolerance, understanding, friendship, and cooperation among all our citizens, and greater respect for the differences and beliefs of our people, and
- WHEREAS, understanding and cooperation between men of all faiths were the foundations upon which our Nation's founding fathers built the structure of our liberty, and
- WHEREAS, the people of Minnesota, though drawn from many varied backgrounds of race, religious faith and national origin, are unified in their devotion to their country and to the American way of life founded upon basic rights guaranteed by the Declaration of Independence and the Constitution,

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Karl F. Rolvaag, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of February 20 - 27, 1966, as,

"BROTHERHOOD WEEK"

in Minnesota and urge all of our people to observe this week so that it may be a period in which to reaffirm our determination that equality and individual liberties shall be preserved in a spirit of brotherhood and understanding.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this twenty-first day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred sixty-six and of the State the one hundred eighth.
