

PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, in spite of the efforts by individual citizens to use caution and care, the number who die and many who are injured through accidents and illness each year steadily increases, and

WHEREAS, there are hazards in the home and on the highways that lie beyond the conscious control of the individual, even beyond his human intent and awareness of moral responsibility, and

WHEREAS, it is fitting that we set aside a period of time to focus public attention on the necessity of protection against accident and sickness, emphasizing the importance of a reverence for life, one's own as well as the lives of others,

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Karl F. Rolvaag, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of April 10, 1966, as

"ACCIDENT AND HEALTH PROTECTION WEEK"

in Minnesota in recognition of the insurance industry and its vital contributions to the protection of human life, health and property.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this twenty-first day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and sixty-six, and of the State the one hundred eighth.
