SO THEREFORE, Be it resolved by the Common Council of the City of Rochester, Minnesota:

That Harold "Dutch" DeVries is hereby declared to be elected to the office of Alderman-At-Large of the City of Rochester, at the Charter Election held March 8th, 1966, to hold office for two years and until his successor is elected and qualified;

That Archie M. Ackerman is hereby declared to be elected to the office of City Treasurer of the City of Rochester, at the Charter Election held March 8th, 1966, to hold office for one year and until his successor is elected and qualified;

That David A. Shulman is hereby declared to be elected to the office of Justice of the Peace styled "City Justice" of the City of Rochester, at the Charter Election held March 8th, 1966, to hold office for one year and until his successor is elected and qualified;

That William S. LaPlante is hereby declared to be elected to the office of Judge of Municipal Court of the City of Rochester, at the Charter Election held March 8th, 1966, to hold office for six years and until his successor is elected and qualified;

That Donald C. Steiner is hereby declared to be elected to the office of Special Judge of Municipal Court of the City of Rochester, at the Charter Election held March 8th, 1966, to hold office for six years and until his successor is elected and qualified;

That Vincent Folkert is hereby declared to be elected to the office of Alderman of the Second Ward of the City of Rochester, at the Charter Election held March 8th, 1966, to hold office for two years and until his successor is elected and qualified;

That Ulrich J. "Ole" Eichten is hereby declared to be elected to the office of Alderman of the Fourth Ward of the City of Rochester, at the Charter Election held March 8th, 1966, to hold office for two years and until his successor is elected and qualified;

That D. Dewey Day is hereby declared to be elected to the office of Alderman of the Sixth Ward of the City of Rochester, at the Charter Election held March 8th, 1966, to hold office for two years and until his successor is elected and qualified.

Be it further resolved that the total number of votes cast at said election on Amendment No. 1 was 3,077 of which 2,525 votes were in favor of its adoption. That the votes in favor of the amendment were more than the required 55% of the total votes cast thereon, and therefore the amendment was declared duly adopted.

Be it further resolved that the total number of votes cast at said election on Amendment No. 2 was 3,065 of which 2,006 votes were in favor of its adoption. That the votes in favor of the amendment were more than the required 55% of the total votes cast thereon, and therefore the amendment was declared duly adopted.

## AMENDMENT NO. 1

To amend Section 3 of the Charter of the City of Rochester to provide that the wards of the City shall be composed of compact, contiguous territory, each containing as nearly as practicable an equal population; to provide that ward boundaries shall be redetermined by the Common Council after each census to provide that if the Common Council fails to redetermine ward boundaries within six months after a census the boundaries shall be redetermined within three months thereafter and after a public hearing by a ward boundary commission composed of the mayor, the Alderman-at-Large and the President of the Charter Commission to provide for assigning to appropriate wards all areas subsequently annexed to the City and to provide for the application of redetermined boundaries to subsequent elections.

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The Charter Commission of the City of Rochester having reviewed Ordinance No. 1328 heretofore submitted by the Common Council of the City of Rochester to this Charter Commission for review pursuant to Minnesota Statutes 410.27 hereby suggests and proposes that the following proposed amendment to the Charter of the City of Rochester be substituted for said ordinance and presented to the voters of the City of Rochester in the manner provided by statute:

## AMENDMENT

#### of the CHARTER of the

#### CITY OF ROCHESTER

## Rochester, Minnesota

The Charter of the City of Rochester, adopted pursuant to Minnesota Constitution, Article 4, Section 36, and Minnesota Laws, 1903, Chapter 238, and ratified August 22, 1904, as amended, be further amended as follows:

That Section 3 thereof be repealed in its entirety and the following substituted therefor:

"SECTION 3. The City shall be divided into six (6) wards, called the First, Second, Third, Fourth, Fifth and Sixth Wards.

"Each ward shall be composed of compact, contiguous territory and shall contain as nearly as practicable an equal population. Wherever possible ward boundary lines shall follow the center lines of streets, avenues, alleys and boulevards and shall run due east and west and north and south.

"Population shall be determined from the official certified United States decennial census or from any other intermediate or special official certified census which determines the population of the City of Rochester by usable: census tracts.

"Within six (6) months after the official certified United States decennial census is filed in the office of the Secretary of State of the State of Minnesota and within six (6) months after the official certified copy of any intermediate or special population census by usable census tracts is filed in the office of the said Secretary of State, or, if not to be so filed, is officially and publicly announced, the Common Council of the City of Rochester shall redetermine the boundaries of the various wards of the City in accordance with the population determined in such census and in accordance with the standards set forth above. Such redetermined ward boundaries shall be established by ordinance duly adopted by a majority of all members of the Common Council but such ordinance shall not be subject to veto by the Mayor.

"If the Common Council shall fail to adopt an ordinance redetermining ward boundaries within the six (6) months period prescribed, said boundaries shall be redetermined and established within three (3) months thereafter by written order of the Ward Boundary Commission which shall consist of the Mayor, the Alderman at Large and the President of the Charter Commission of the City of Rochester. The Mayor shall act as Chairman and the President of the Charter Commission of the City as Secretary of the Ward Boundary Commission." Any two members of the Ward Boundary Commission may adopt the order redetermining and establishing ward boundaries. Before making its order redetermining and establishing ward boundaries, the Ward Boundary Commission shall hold at least one public hearing to which the Common Council shall be invited and at which interested residents of the City may express their views on the subject. The order of the Ward Boundary Commission shall be published in the same manner provided for ordinances.

"The ordinance adopted by the Common Council or the order of the Ward Boundary Commission redetermining and establishing ward boundaries shall be effective upon completion of publication.

"Areas subsequently annexed to the City shall become a part of the adjoining ward. The determination of the City Clerk as to the proper assignment of subsequently annexed areas to the appropriate ward shall be conclusive.

"No redetermination of ward boundaries shall apply to any City elections if the establishment of the redetermined boundaries goes into effect after the first date for filing for any such election. An assignment of a subsequently annexed area to a ward shall not be considered a redetermination of ward boundaries.

"All officers of the City whose appointment or election is required by the provisions of this Charter may serve out the term for which they are appointed of elected notwithstanding redetermination of ward boundaries.

"This amendment shall be effective upon adoption and the Common Council shall redetermine and establish ward boundaries in the manner prescribed above but within six (6) months after the effective date of this amendment and, upon its failure to do so, the Ward Boundary Commission shall do so in the manner prescribed above within three (3) months thereafter."

The foregoing proposed amendment to the Charter of the City of Rochester is hereby proposed to the people of said City by the Charter Commission thereof, pursuant to Minnesota Constitution, Article XI, Section 4, and Minnesota Statutes, Section 410.12, and is hereby delivered to the Clerk of said City in order that it may be submitted to the voters in accordance with the provisions of said Constitution and Statutes.

"Section 293. The following elective officials of the City shall receive salaries at the following annual rates:

 Mayor.
 \$3,000.00

 Alderman at Large.
 \$2,100.00

 Each Ward Alderman
 \$1,800.00

"In addition to his salary the Mayor shall in any and all events have the exclusive control of a contingency fund in the amount of One Thousand (\$1,000.00) Dollars each year, or in such greater amount as the Common Council may by resolution provide. Expenditures made from this fund shall be subject to such post-audit as the Common Council may provide."
