PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, the creativity and intellectual self-reliance of every individual as well as his vocational competence are developed by education, and

WHEREAS, one person in four currently is engaged in pursuing an education, whether preschool, elementary, secondary, higher, adult, or vocational, and

WHEREAS, the rapid rate of scientific discovery is radically decreasing the number of jobs available to the under-educated and increasing the necessity for all workers to be capable of continuously re-educating themselves, and

WHEREAS, the teachers of the nation and the State of Minnesota are thus in a position of high responsibility for the public and personal welfare of the nation and its citizens,

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Karl E. Polvay, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby designate April, 1966, as

"TEACHING CAREER MONTH"

In Minnesota, in order to recognize the importance of the task accomplished by the teachers of this country, and to elicit the public support necessary to encourage them to continue in this task.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this eleventh day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and sixty-six and of the State, the one hundred eighth.
