PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, many young Minnesotans ages 16 through 21 experience unusual difficulty in obtaining full-time employment due to lack of sufficient academic achievement or vocational skills, and

WHEREAS, these young people represent the future economy of our State and our Nation and are its most important resource, and

whereas, the Economic Opportunity Act of 1964 was enacted to eliminate the many causes of poverty, many of which are directly attributeble to educational deficiencies and unemployment, and

WHEREAS, this Act seeks to provide opportunity for education and training, the opportunity to work, and the opportunity to live in decency and dignity through the education offered by such special training facilities as those established by the Job Corps,

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Kanl F. Rolvang, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the period April 15, 1966, through May 15, 1966, as

"JOB CORPS OPPORTUNITY MONTH"

and call upon all citizens, groups and agencies to work together to render every assistance and cooperation to the many youth within our State who can qualify for, and personally and collectively benefit from the varuable training and experiences offered by the Job Corps in their quest to provide the skills necessary to assure a well directed, productive life.
