- WHEREAS, Consumer Credit occupies an important place in the nation's economy, and
- WHEREAS, Consumers in greater numbers are receiving convenience and assistance through purchases on credit of goods and services, and
- WHEREAS, it is necessary for their own benefit, and for the protection of the credit structure generally that consumers be encouraged to buy wisely and to pay promptly,

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Karl F. Rolvaag, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the period of April 24 - 30, 1966, as

"CONSUMER CREDIT WEEK"

In Minnesota and do earnestly request all interested in Consumer Credit to continually endeavor to educate the public in the proper use of credit as a relation of mutual trust, and to the value of establishing and maintaining good credit records.
