PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS, the President of the United States has by proclamation designated Wednesday October twenty-fourth as Liberty Day, and

WHEREAS, it is essential to the successful completion of the Second Liberty Loan that the people of each state cooperate with the Federal Government,

NOW THEREFORE, I, J.A.A. Burnquist, Governor of the State of Minnesota, proclaim Wednesday, October twenty-fourth, as Liberty Day within our state and urge that on the afternoon of said day all public places and stores be closed and that the mayors, all local authorities and all public officials, together with all citizens, encourage patriotic demonstrations and do everything in their power to make the Liberty Loan Campaign a success.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have caused the Great Seal of the State to be hereto affixed and have set my hand hereunto this eighteenth day of October, 1917, at the Capitol in the city of Saint Paul.
