ORDINANCE #

46

An Ordinance Extending the Corporate Limits of the Village of Hamburg, to include certain unplatted lands not exceeding 200 acres

Section 1. = A petition has been filed with the governing body of the Village of Hamburg, Minnesota by Robert W. Buckentin, Otto Buckentin and Magdalena Buckentin, the owners of and having an interest in the following described real estate to have such lands included within the Village of Hamburg, Minnesota,

Commencing at a point 25 1/2 rods North of the Southeast Corner of Section 29, Township 115, North of Range 26 West; thence running North along the Section line between Sections 28 and 29, a distance of 90 feet to a point; which point is the point of beginning of the tract to be herein described; thence continuing North on same line, a distance of 247 feet to a point; thence West, parallel with Section line between Sections 29 and 32, a distance of 165 feet to a point; thence South parallel with Section line between Sections 28 and 29, a distance of 247 feet to a point; thence East parallel with Section line between Sections 29 and 32, a distance of 165 feet to the place of beginning.

Lying and being in the Southeast Quarter of the Southeast Quarter of Section 29, Township 115 North of Range 26 West.

Section 2. = The quantity of land embraced within the foregoing description, and bounded as described is .93 acre.

Section 3. = The Village Council hereby determines (1) that the annexation will be to the best interest of the Village of Hamburg, Minnesota., and of the territory affected; (2) that the territory described herein abutts upon the Village of Hamburg and is so conditioned as properly to be subjected to Village Government.

Section 4. = Therefore the Village of Hamburg Minnesota hereby ordains and declares that the property hereinbefore described be and the same is hereby annexed to, and included in the Village of Hamburg, Minnesota, as effectually as if it had originally been a part thereof.

Section 5. = This ordinance shall be final and shall take effect and be in force from and after filing a certified copy thereof with the Minnesota Municipal Commission, the County Auditor, and the Secretary of State, and from and after its passage and publication.
