PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, today the word freedom is as important to our history as it was in 1776, and the unalienable rights to life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness, as guaranteed by the Constitution of every American citizen, is being challenged on many fronts, and

WHEREAS, our first line of defense against the enemies of freedom is our law enforcement agencies, and

WHEREAS, understanding is the watchword to compatibility, and it is important that the people of our city know and understand the problems, duties and responsibilities of their police department,

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Karl F. Relvaag, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim May 15 - 21, 1966, as

"NATIONAL POLICE WEEK"

and May 15, 1966, as

"LAU OFFICERS MEMORIAL DAY"

In the State of Minnesota and urge all citizens to take advantage of this opportunity to honor the police officers of our community and to provide a wider base of understanding of their daily work.
