WHEREAS, through such annual celebrations can be created a spirit of festivity and pride amongst our people for their heritage and recognition of the fact that such spirit has much to offer America in the years to come,

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Karl F. Rolvaag, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim September 6, 1966, as
