

PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, a basic freedom in our American life is to select an occupation of our own choosing, to develop our talents, our productive and economic potentials to the utmost, and

WHEREAS, profound social, economic and technological changes in our society rapidly are changing the structure of occupations and industries, so that most individuals will need to make one or more occupational changes in their lifetimes, and

WHEREAS, the Congress of the United States has recognized these problems and acted upon them in such legislation as the National Defense Education Act, the Manpower Development and Training Act, the Vocational Education Act of 1963, the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965, and the Economic Opportunity Act, and

WHEREAS, professional vocational guidance makes a maximum contribution to the process whereby an individual develops purpose and direction in his life's work and provides vital assistance to individuals in selecting, locating, and training for job and career opportunities which benefit the individual and strengthen our society,

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Karl F. Polvegg, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of October 29 - 31, 1966, as

"VOCATIONAL GUIDANCE WEEK"

in the State of Minnesota, and urge all citizens to observe the week by making themselves better acquainted with the services offered by professional counselors and the extent to which each citizen can benefit from these services.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this twenty-eighth day of September in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and sixty-six and of the State, the one hundred ninth.
