WHEREAS, of the less than 11 of all auto accidents caused by tire failures, 90% of tire failures result from worn tires, and


WHEREAS, it is the duty of every citizen to contribute to his own and his family's safety by examining the tires on his car for damage or excess wear,


NOW, THEREFORE, I, Karl F. Rolvaag, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of October 9, 1966, as


