

PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, the State of Minnesota contributes measurably to a national mail volume equal to the rest of the world combined, and

WHEREAS, in order to cope with this tremendous volume the Post Office Department has issued regulations defining a second and third class volume mailing so present to ZIP Code by January 1 of 1967, and

WHEREAS, government agencies at the federal, state, county and municipal level have also been called upon to abide by essentially the same regulations with respect to their volume mail, and

WHEREAS, the success of the ZIP Code program depends on the cooperation of the individual as well as the members of the business community,

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Karl F. Polvay, Governor of the State of Minnesota, herein proclaim the week of October 10, 1966, as

"ZIP CODE WEEK"

and call upon the citizens of the State to have and use their ZIP Codes, to urge their friends to do the same, and to join with business, civic, educational and service organizations in ceremonies appropriate to the occasion as evidence of their commitment to a more efficient Postal Service operating under our free enterprise system.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this fifteenth day of September in the year of one thousand nine hundred and sixty-six and of the State, the one hundred ninth.
