

PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, December 7, 1966 marks the 25th anniversary of Pearl Harbor, and

WHEREAS, December 7, recalls a day that Americans will never forget and whose significance must be taught to our youth, and

WHEREAS, The Pearl Harbor survivors stand as a living testimony of the savage and unprovoked attack upon our Nation at Pearl Harbor, and of our continuing obligation to be prepared to defend ourselves,

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Karl F. Rolvaag, Governor of the State of Minnesota do hereby proclaim December 7, 1966 as

"PEARL HARBOR REMEMBRANCE DAY"

in Minnesota and urge attention to the proper commemoration of this event in American history, and due honor to the defenders of Pearl Harbor.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this seventeenth day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and sixty-six and of the State, the one hundred ninth.
