This office has this day received from Hon. John A. Johnson, Governor of Minnesota, a copy of the report of Hon. A. Shaefer, Public Examiner, of the Oil Inspector's Department of Minnesota for the period from Feby. 1st, 1903 to Feby. 1st, 1905, covering the incumbency of Fenton G. Warner, Oil Inspector during said period.
