PROCLAMATION

- WHEREAS, the American Way of Life and Government, shall not be undermined by foreign propaganda, the ideology of which is diametrically opposed to that of the United States of America, and
- WHEREAS, the Bill of Rights shall not be used as a means to distort and destroy the basic principles for which the Bill of Rights stands, and
- WHEREAS, it is necessary NOW, more than ever before the call upon the American people to do their utmost to act conceretedly and with determination to uphold the sacred principles of American Unity, upon which the Bill of Rights is based and defend them from all the attackers, and
- WHEREAS, the late President Franklin D. Roosevelt in 1941 and President Harry S. Truman in 1946, respectively authorized by Joint House Resolutions, signed a proclamation designating December 15, as Bill of Rights Day,

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Karl F. Rolvaag, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Thursday, December 15, 1966, as

"BILL OF RIGHTS DAY"

in Minnesota and call upon officials of the State to display the flag of the United States on all Government buildings on that day and to invite the people of the State to observe that day with appropriate ceremonies and prayers.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this fifteenth day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and sixty-six, and of the State the one hundred ninth.
