
KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That I, Clifford L. Hilton, Attorney General of the State of Minnesota, by virtue of the authority vested in me by statute, and particularly by an Act of the Legislature entitled "An Act relating to the duties and powers of the Attorney General and his assistants" approved April 17, 1905, as amended March 12, 1917, do hereby constitute and appoint C. Louis Weeks of Minneapolis, Minnesota, to be Deputy Attorney General of the State of Minnesota for the period commencing March 8, 1918, and ending the first Monday in January, 1919, and until his successor is appointed and qualified, unless sooner revoked.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand at St. Paul, Minnesota, this 8th day of March, 1918.


