National Republic have been living under the oppressive rule of
Communist Russia, being denied the basic freedoms which linger in
their hearts, and

WHEREAS, their continuing struggle for freedom and independence is typical of the struggle of all freedom-leving peoples everywhere, and strongly emphasizes for us -- free Americans -- that the price of freedom is eternal vigilance against continuous encroachments against it both home and abroad, and especially against Communist aggression which seriously threatens the peace and security of the peoples of the world, and

WICHEAS, Americans have a traditional interest in the defense of freedom and human rights and sympathize with the aspirations of freedom-loving peoples wherever freedom is donied, and

WHEREAS, Hinnosotans of Ukrainian descent annually observe the anniversary of the Ukrainian Declaration of Independence, and are observing it this year on January 22, 1967,

NOW THEREPORE, I, Harold Levander, Governor of the State of Minnesota do heroby proclaim Sunday, January 22, 1967, as

PHERATURATION AND PRINCE DAYP

in Winnesote, and urge all citizens of our State to join with me in supporting the struggle of the Ukroinian people to regain their national freedom and a democratic system of government.
