

PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, Presidents' Day has been observed throughout the nation for the past fifteen years, and

WHEREAS, the office of the President of the United States of America is the highest and most important one that an American citizen may attain; and it is the living and working symbol of our American way of life, our Flag, and our Constitution, and

WHEREAS, the free people of our nation and the world face today their greatest trials for survival of this way of life, and

WHEREAS, a study of the lives of our presidents is a study of our American history and heritage,

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Harold LeVander, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Friday, March 3, 1967, as

"PRESIDENTS' DAY"

in Minnesota, and hereby invite the citizens of our state, young and older, to observe the day in such a manner as they may desire in their schools and in other suitable places with ceremonies appropriate to the recognition of the office of the President of the United States of America; and further urge our residents, young and old, to write some letter or postcard to the President of the United States on this date.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this twenty-seventh day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and sixty-seven, and of the State, the one hundred ninth.
