PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, libraries of all kinds have made and are continuing to make great contributions to the intellectual, cultural and economic development of our state, and

WHEREAS, the people of Minnesota have responded with enthusiasm to plan for the continuing development and improvement of libraries of all kinds, and

WHEREAS, this enthusiasm and the work that goes with it must be continued if we are going to continue to develop and improve our libraries, and

WHEREAS, the entire nation has been urged to join in giving special emphasis to the importance of its libraries,

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Harold LeVander, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of April 16-22, 1967, as

"LIBRARY WEEK"

in Minnesota, and urge all of our people to join in paying tribute to our libraries, encourage both young and old to make more extensive use of library facilities, and urge those governmental units and agencies which do not now have libraries to establish them for the continued betterment of our society.
