PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, efficient record keeping is imperative for the success of any business or enterprise; and

WHEREAS, a recent investigation of bankruptcy cases shows that at least three-quarters of the Nation's bankruptcies could have been avoided, and approximately ninety percent of the failures did not keep books; and

WHEREAS, the retailers, wholesalers, agents and manufacturers of stationery and office equipment who are members of the National Stationery and Office Equipment Association are launching a nationwide project to emphasize the importance of record keeping not only in the office but in the home,

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Harold LeLander, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the month of April, 1967, as

"BETTER RECORD KEEPING MONTH"

in Minnesota, and urge our citizens to recognize the importance of better record keeping.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol in the City of Saint Paul this thirty-first day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and sixty-seven, and of the State, the one hundred ninth.
