Under date of April 3rd, 1918, I applied to the General Land Office, Washington, D.C. for survey of an Island in Cooks Lake, Sec. 8, Twp. 52 N. R. 15 W., 4th P.M., Minnesota. The General Land Office is a letter dated April 12th, writes as follows:

"You are also required to serve notices of your intention to apply for the survey of the island upon the Secretary of State and Attorney General at St. Paul, Minnesota, and procure, if possible, acknowledgements thereof and transmit the same to this office for consideration with your application for the survey."
