WHEREAS,

the role of the Women's Army Corps, working with all other units of the Armed Forces in safeguarding freedom, is of vital interest to all Americans, and

WHEREAS,

the Women's Army Corps Veterans Association, celebrating its one twenty-first birthday this year, wishes to commemorate the accomplishments of all the dedicated women who pledged themselves to service to the United States by joining the Women's Army Corps,

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Harold LeVander, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim May 14, 1967, as

WOMEN'S ARMY CORPS MEMORIAL DAY

in Minnesota, and urge all Minnesotans to make fitting observance of this day in honor of our service women.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol in the City of Saint Paul this twenty-first day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and sixty-seven, and of the State, the one hundred ninth.
