PROCLAMATION

- WHEREAS, some seven million people in the United States now enjoy the healthful recreation and sportsmanship of the game of golf, and
- WHEREAS, the Professional Golfers Association of America will sponsor the sixteenth annual National Golf Day on Tuesday, May 30, 1967, and
- WHEREAS, during the last fifteen years, over \$2,000,000 has been realized from National Golf Day for United Service Organizations, the American Red Cross, Caddie Scholarship Funds, the U. S. Blind Golfers Association, the National Amputee Golf Association, the Jagger War Memorial Fund, golf facilities at Veterans' Hospitals and Military Installations, Turf Research and Education, Golf Professional Education, financial assistance to those in straitened circumstances who have devoted their lives to golf, and
- WHEREAS, this day in 1967 will offer all the golfers of America an opportunity to again assist many of these worthy charities and projects as well as an opportunity to compete against the PGA champion and the USGA Open champion,

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Harold Levander, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Tuesday, May 30, 1967, as

"GOLF DAY"

in Minnesota, and urge all the golfers of our State to cooperate in this worthwhile venture by playing a round of golf on National Golf Day, thereby contributing to the many deserving charities and projects associated with this great game.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this twenty-sixth day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and sixty-seven, and of the State, the one hundred ninth.
